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Making “Drop Coins Here” Stickers

All modern small sign stores can make stickers on heavy duty peel-and-stick vinyl label stock with a clear-coat finish for added durability. I suggest that you have a few extra made in case you ever need them. We have them made in English by the thousands, but local sign makers can easily make small quantities for you. The dimensions are shown below, but we recommend that you wait until you see the actual samples and can show them to your local sign store.

But waiting won't have to delay your ability to place your Well when it arrives and start raising money immediately. There is an easy way to make temporary stickers.

Temporary Starting Stickers

You can create stickers on your computer and print them with your own printer, then affix them to the ramps with clear tape. If you print them on peel-and-stick paper, you don't even have to use the clear tape, although it helps protect the paper and ink.


If you have some wide clear packaging tape, it can work very well, and will look professional. They won't last permanently, but they will definitely get you started while you have permanent stickers made.

- 1) Print the label on regular paper (or heavy duty paper if you have it...glossy works even better).
- 2) Cut it out as illustrated by the red lines below.
- 3) With the label resting on a counter or some other clean hard surface, place 2 overlapping strips of wide clear packaging tape across the label as illustrated by the black dotted lines, trying not to press the tape too hard against the table...just on the paper.
- 4) Pick up the entire tape-and-paper assembly, and cut the tape as illustrated by the blue lines. Notice that the final width of the cut tape cannot be more than 2 inches (5 cm) in order to fit on the coin launch ramp.
- 5) Affix the sticker onto the ramps where it is held in place by the tape that is extending beyond the sticker, represented by the area between the red and blue lines.
- 6) Burnish the tape to the paper and plastic ramps by rubbing it back and forth with a soft cloth while applying pressure. This will “affix” it to the ramp.
- 7) When you get your permanent stickers, you can remove the temporary stickers with a sharp knife or razor blade, being careful not to scratch the surface of the plastic ramp. You can then remove any gummy tape residue with WD-40 or other light oil and a cloth. Then remove the oil residue with Windex or common soap and water. Make sure it is clean and dry before applying the permanent stickers.
